1) Fulbright U.S. Scholar Program AY 2022-2023 – Deadline September 15, 2021

The U.S. Fulbright Scholar Program offers awards to teach, conduct research, or a combination of teaching and research, in more than 135 countries. Awards range from a few months to a full year abroad, and many offer flexible durations.

In order to meet the changing needs of academia and better accommodate the interests and commitments of today's scholars, the program includes several innovative program options such as: [Fulbright Postdoctoral/Early Career Awards](#), [Global Scholar Awards](#), and [Fulbright Distinguished Scholar Awards](#). U.S. citizenship is required.

The application deadline for most awards is **September 15, 2021**.

2) Application Support: UArizona Fulbright Scholar Liaisons

UArizona has two designated Fulbright Scholar Liaisons in Research Development Services who provide faculty with application proposal support, meet with interested faculty to answer their Fulbright questions, and help faculty find the Fulbright award that best fits their interest and goals.

3) Fulbright Specialist Program – Rolling Deadline

The Fulbright Specialist program pairs highly qualified U.S. academics and professionals with host institutions abroad to share their expertise, strengthen institutional linkages, while building capacity at their overseas host institutions for short-term durations of two to six weeks.

Applicants to the Fulbright Specialist Program are competitively selected to join the Fulbright Specialist Roster based on their knowledge, skill sets, and ability to make a significant contribution to projects overseas.

Those applicants who are selected to join the Fulbright Specialist Roster are then eligible to be matched with approved projects designed by foreign host institutions. Once abroad, Fulbright Specialists partner with their host institution to conduct project activities in support of the host institution's priorities and goals.

4) Fulbright International Education Administrators (IEA) Seminars

The International Education Administrators (IEA) Seminars are two weeks duration abroad to foster connections between U.S. higher education administrators and their counterparts in other countries. IEA Fulbright Scholars gain in-depth knowledge about the host country's higher education system and return with the enhanced ability to contribute to their institution's internationalization efforts.

The IEA Seminars are offered in four countries: Korea, France, Germany, and Russia. They are open to experienced U.S. higher education administrators contributing to the internationalization of their institutions.
