# Policy on Student Use of Social Media and Class Listservs

## Summary

This policy establishes guidelines for student use of College of Medicine – Tucson social media platforms and listservs, requiring compliance with existing college policies and professional standards and outlining expectations for appropriate use of these communication tools.

# Applicability & Scope

This policy applies to all medical students at the College of Medicine – Tucson, effective beginning Academic Year 2025–26.

#### **Policy Statement**

#### I. Student Use of Social Media and Class Listservs

#### A. Purpose and Compliance Requirements

- The College of Medicine Tucson (COM-T) social media platforms and listservs are intended to serve as a useful forum for the exchange of information that is relevant to the operations of the COM-T.
- 2) Postings must adhere to professionalism standards expected of medical students and be consistent with all applicable policies, including the University of Arizona <u>Electronic Mail Policy</u> and <u>Acceptable Use of Computers and Networks Policy</u>, the COM-T <u>Professional Conduct Policy</u>, and the ABOR <u>Student Code of Conduct</u>.
- 3) Students must follow any additional guidelines set by clinical sites for social media use and comply with health information confidentiality laws, including HIPAA.

#### B. Terms of Use

- 1) COM-T platforms are not considered public forums and are subject to moderation and usage restrictions.
- 2) Use of COM-T-administered platforms and listservs is a privilege.
- 3) The COM-T reserves the right to limit content and restrict or suspend the access of any student who misuses or abuses the platform, including but not limited to:
  - a) posts that violate policy or are otherwise irrelevant to the business of the COM-T;
  - b) posts that use inappropriate, disrespectful, or unprofessional language or tone; and
  - c) excessive and/or repetitive posts.

## C. Reporting

 Students should not use social media platforms or listservs to report concerns about mistreatment, discrimination, or violations of policy. Instead, they should utilize the reporting channels outlined on the <u>COM-T Professionalism Website</u>.
