About the Presenter: Dr. Kim Eagle is the Albion Walter Hewlett Professor of Internal Medicine and the Frankel Cardiovascular Center director at the University of Michigan Health System. He earned his medical degree from Tufts University in 1979. His residency and chief residency in internal medicine were at Yale-New Haven Hospital (1979-83), followed by research and clinical fellowships in cardiology and health services research at Harvard Medical School and Massachusetts General Hospital (1983-86). He served on faculty there and later as associate director of clinical cardiology until moving to the U of M in 1994. Dr. Eagle's outcomes research team has led QI initiatives across the state of Michigan in acute myocardial infarctions, heart failure and coronary intervention. He has published 782 peer-reviewed articles, 77 chapters, and edited eight books. More than 115,000 learners in 33 U.S. states and 12 countries have attended his presentations. Dr. Eagle has been active with the American College of Cardiology, the NIH's National Heart, Lung, and Blood Institute, and the American Heart Association and Association of University Cardiologists, as well as World Medical Relief — earning numerous honors. In 2014, U of M and his grateful patients created the Kim A. Eagle Professorship in Cardiovascular Medicine and an endowed research fund bearing his name. And, in 2024, the Eagle Fund for Education was created to support specialized training of U of M's Cardiovascular Medicine fellows.
