Physicians teach every day but what does it mean to be an effective teacher? Being an effective physician does not necessarily mean that you are prepared to be an effective teacher. The Michigan State University College of Human Medicine, Office of Medical Education Research and Development has partnered with the Department of Medicine at University of Arizona College of Medicine-Tucson** to create the Academy of Clinicians as Teachers (ACT) Certificate Program. In this program, clinical educators will work on questioning, observation and feedback, creating an optimum learning environment, and other student-centered teaching strategies. At the end of the program, participants will have a strong start on scholarship around their experience as a medical educator and a certificate as a graduate of the ACT program.

**This program is open to Core Faculty, Associate Program Directors, and Newly Appointed Program Directors (less than 3 years in your role) in the Department of Medicine at the University of Arizona College of Medicine-Tucson.

Benefits:

- Collaborate with other clinician educators, sharing ideas and strategies
- Become more proficient and confident in teaching skills
- Develop as a medical education scholar

Certificate Program Unique Features:

- Practice applying ideas discussed in study groups and analyze results of practice
- Learn how to use Action Research to improve your teaching practice and engage in scholarly work on your teaching
- Present results of your Action Research in the ACT Luncheon Showcase in May
- Earn up to 13 *AMA PRA Category 1 CME Credits™*

 - 3 credits for prep modules
 - 1 credit for project coaching meetings

- Scholarly project work January - May (6+ hours)
